We are deeply saddened to report the passing of longtime member and friend Catherine Smeltzer, who served as Chapter President and is a recipient of our Lifetime Achievement Award. Her obituary follows:

Catherine Brownlee Smeltzer of Roanoke, Virginia, passed away on Tuesday, February 6, 2024, surrounded by her loving family.

She was born on Thanksgiving, November 25,1937, in Gainesville,



Florida, to Mamie and Milton Brownlee. Catherine graduated valedictorian of Gainesville High School and Cum Laude in chemistry from Sweet Briar College. She also attended St. Andrews University in Scotland for her junior year. In August of 1959, she married Michael Smeltzer. They moved to Roanoke in 1963, and Catherine began her career as a commercial real estate appraiser and achieved her MAI designation with the Appraisal Institute. As a very active member of the local chapter, she served as its president and earned the lifetime service award.

### **Industry Note**

The Uniform Appraisal Dataset (UAD) and Forms Redesign team has released an updated timeline for the initiative. The overall timeline has not changed; however, we wanted to provide industry with more milestone details to help in the development, testing, and training to prepare for the new UAD and Uniform Residential Appraisal Report (URAR).

Access the resources and learn more

The Fannie Mae Selling Guide was updated with changes that can affect appraisers. This update includes "Crime rate or related data" and "crime (and its variants)" as examples in the Unacceptable Appraisal Practices section. Click here to read the Appraisal Foundation's recently released question and answer on using crime-related information in appraisal reports. They also added condominiums as eligible properties for value acceptance + property data. In rare cases, a value acceptance + property data offer is lost due to a change in qualifying loan characteristics after the property data collection has been delivered. In these cases, Fannie Mae will accept a hybrid appraisal informed by the property data collection (PDC). To accommodate condominium properties, they added the Individual Condominium Unit Appraisal Report (Hybrid) to the Selling Guide, which must be used for appraisals of one-unit (attached and detached) properties in condo projects that are based on interior and exterior PDC. 7-Hour National USPAP Continuing Education Course Thursday, March 7, 2024

### 7 CE hours Instructor: Joseph Durrer, MAI, SRA

This required 7-hour CE course focuses on USPAP requirements for ethical behavior and competent performance by appraisers. New case studies and tools are provided to help you learn how to better navigate USPAP in order to solve problems in your daily appraisal practice, and a USPAP Reference Manual is included with the course handbook. NOTE. Appraisers must successfully complete the 7-Hour National USPAP Continuing Education Course every 2 years to meet the USPAP CE requirement. Registration includes course materials (not the USPAP Standards from the Appraisal Foundation). When you register, the default is to download the course material. If you want hardcopy you have to select that option for an extra fee. You are required to have this material in class, hardcopy or downloaded on a computer.

### Appraisal Institute President Testifies Supporting Expanded Opportunities for Appraisers in Federal Land Management and Conservation Efforts

Washington, DC, January 31, 2024 -- Appraisal Institute Board President Sandra Adomatis, SRA, this morning provided expert testimony before the House Natural Resources Committee Subcommittee on Federal Lands in support H.R. 5443, the Accelerating Appraisals and Conservation Efforts (AACE) Act. Representing the leading association of real estate appraisers, Adomatis expressed support for the legislation and the ways it would increase the pool of available appraisers to the Department of the Interior by allowing certified general appraisers credentialed in one state to perform appraisals or other valuation services in any other State working under the authority of the Department of Interior (DOI).

Adomatis also emphasized the importance of the legislation making clear the DOI should look first within the state where the appraisal is taking place before they seek appraisers from other states, and she highlighted the value of local appraiser expertise.

The 2024 Appraisal Institute Board President also discussed the investment the Appraisal Institute is making to recruit and train new generations of professional appraisers, including the Appraisal Diversity Initiative (ADI), the Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal (PAREA) program and growing collaborations with colleges and universities. Also noted was other pro appraiser legislation the Appraisal Institute is supporting such as the H.R. 2771, the Portal for Appraisal Licensing Act.

Members of the Committee, including the AACE Act's sponsor Rep. Susie Lee, D-NV, thanked Adomatis and the Appraisal Institute for their work in support of the AACE Act and discussed how the legislation would help speed up conservation and economic development and ease an appraisal bottleneck at the DOI. Rep. Lee also emphasized how important it was for DOI to continue to work with local appraisers first.

Adomatis commented, "I was delighted to speak on behalf of our members in support of this commonsense legislation that both expands opportunities for professional appraisers and assists the Department of the Interior in its Federal Land Management and Conservation efforts. And I always welcome the chance to highlight our commitment to recruiting new and diverse generations of appraisers, one of our highest priorities and efforts backed by significant investment in time and Appraisal Institute resources."
